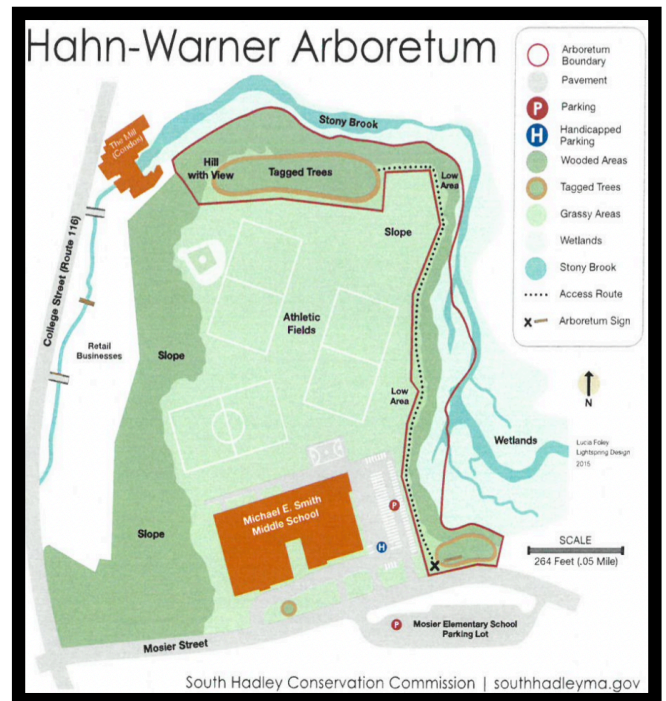


FISCAL YEAR 2023 ANNUAL BUDGET
