Traffic: There are construction projects in the works that will temporarily affect traffic patterns over the summer. For the latest information, sign up for alerts on the Town website at:

- Route 116/Newton St will be closed to through traffic for up to six working days while the culvert beneath the road is fully replaced. Project will run from July to September with the closure expected in August.
- Pitroff Ave will be affected during a 6-8 week water main project over the summer. Notice was sent to affected residents

Lovingly known as the “Gerry B”, the 12 passenger plus two wheelchair van used by the Council on Aging will be a decade old next year. The vehicle is named after Gerry Bernard, a longtime volunteer who donated the bus in 2014. The Town was recently notified that it will receive a Community Transit Grant Program to purchase a new vehicle expected to arrive in 2024. The Town will have to provide a



\$22k match, but will save most of the \$85,000 appropriated by Town Meeting already.
