TOWN ADMINISTRATOR ON THE ROAD

On Monday, Town Administrator Lisa Wong held a discussion with her colleagues - Kittery, Maine Town Manager Kendra Amaral and Eau Claire, Wisconsin Town Manager Stephanie Hirsch - about holding the top job as a female executive to a packed room at the 2024 ICMA conference in Pittsburgh. The three have worked together for almost 20 years in various roles and work to support and mentor women in the public sector.

Lisa joined the White House Initiative on Asian American, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders, federal agencies, policy experts, and community leaders at a Policy Summit in Washington DC on Thursday. Lisa has previously been appointed to lead an Environmental Justice working group at the Environmental Protection Agency under the Obama Administration and returned to serve as the Vice Chair of the EPA's Local Government Advisory Group under the Biden Administration.
