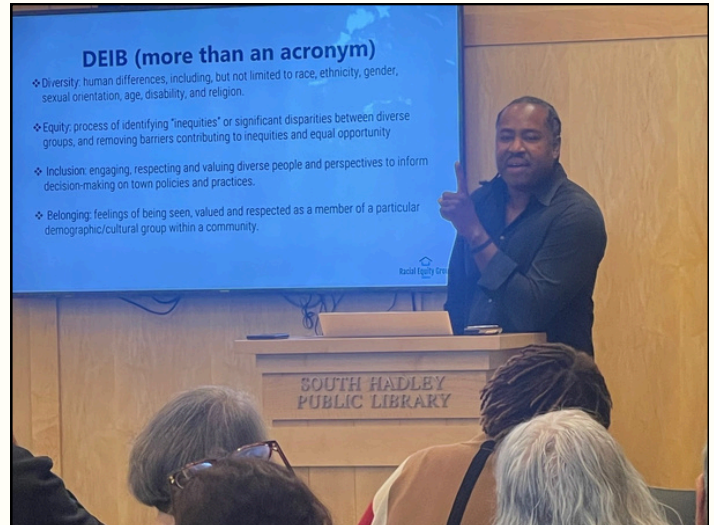
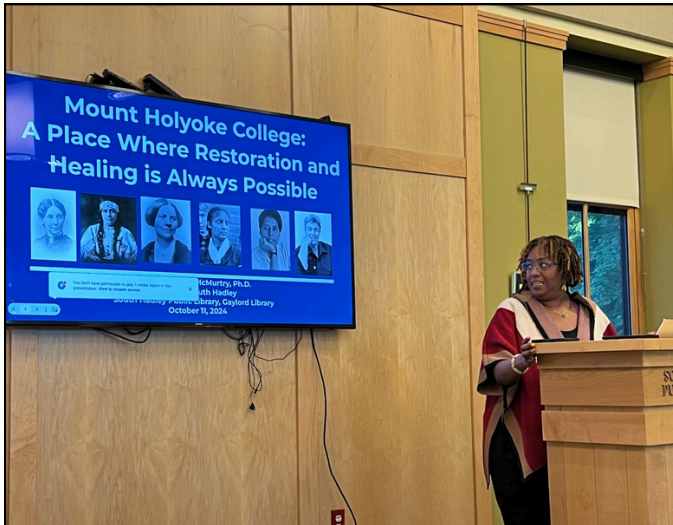

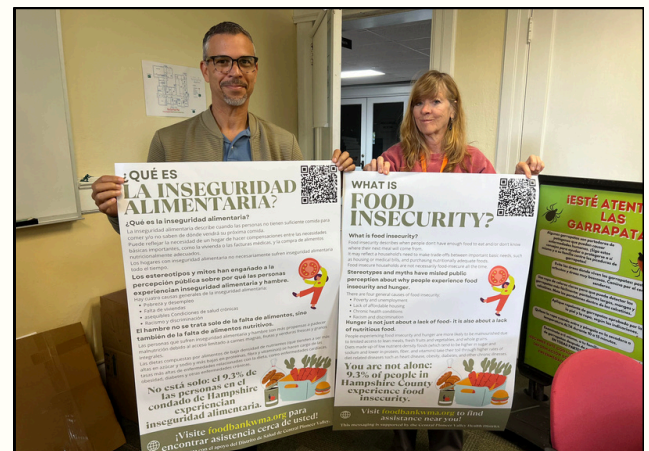
MASTER PLAN FORUM
