

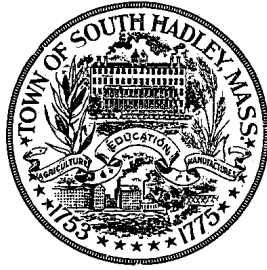



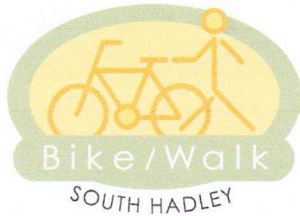

LEAPING WELL NATURE TRAIL

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A BIKE-PED TRAIL SYSTEM ON THE TOTTH PROPERTY

OVERVIEW & RATIONALE:

In the Town's 2016 Master Bike-Ped Plan, the Bike-Walk Committee (BWC) had included the potential use of the Toth Property as part of its List of Recommendations for trail development (which can be found in the Appendix of the Master Report).

This document further details BWC's recommendation to develop this abandoned 21-acre property, located off Newton Street that the Town now owns, into a network of off-road walking and biking trails that the Town presently lacks, while protecting its associated wetlands and endangered species, e.g. wood turtle, box turtle.

As instructed by Mike Sullivan, Town Administrator, BWC's proposal is made without regard for feasibility, restrictions, costs, logistics, funding sources and other town departments' input in this recommendation phase for trail development on this property.

Connection Points

The Toth Property location is central in town and therefore superb for connectivity to many other connection points: Mosier Elementary School and Michael E. Smith Middle School, the Hahn-Warner Arboretum and the designated/painted bike lanes on Route 116, which in turn connects to other areas of town. Following Rt. 116 South, there is an easy connection to the Black Stevens Conservation Area that is situated between the High School (on Rt. 116) and the Plains Elementary School. Other connection points in town from the Toth Property include the secondary roads, e.g. Belmont Ave/Richview Ave/Pittroff Avenue, to Lyman St. and Granby Rd. (Rt. 202), which further connect to East Street and the Byran Conservation Area off Rt. 202 heading north.

Continuing with a connection from the Toth property to Rt. 116 and to Rt. 33 would be the to-be-developed old Big Y building in the Woodlawn Plaza and then further on Rt. 33 South, the "new" Big Y Grocery Store and its plaza, and Buttery Brook Park.

The Council On Aging/Senior Center, currently located on Dayton St. off Rt. 116, would be served by the development of ADA-accessible trails on the nearby Toth property, particularly since sidewalks on Rt. 116 exist (although in some sections, not currently in the best shape) from the CoA to Newton Manor Street. The Newton Manor complex itself would greatly benefit from its close proximity to the Toth property and provide a welcome opportunity for those residents to easily access trails that they cannot do so now.

There is a potential connection opportunity to/from the Mount Holyoke College campus, such as its Prospect Hill trails, via Morgan Street and Stanton Avenue (a dead end), which if feasible, would connect to the back of the Hahn-Warner Arboretum and Michael E. Smith Middle School (Stony Brook is also situated in this area).

Moving farther afield in South Hadley, a new connectivity would be created between the to-be-built River-To-Range (R2R) Trail and the Toth Property via Rt. 116 and Ferry Street. Finishing the sidewalk on Ferry Street to the R2R Trail parking lot would create a safer buffer zone from traffic for pedestrians accessing the R2R Trail.

Collaborative Relationships

Developing the Toth property for biking and walking trails taps into the Town's desire to create and enhance collaborative relationships between Town government and business entities in South Hadley. For example, the Toth property could provide an outstanding learning and networking opportunity as a "field laboratory" for the public schools and Mount Holyoke College (Miller-Worley Center for the Environment) for ecology and other science-based projects, including the ability to support and work with the Town's Conservation Commission.

It would further provide the public in general with a unique understanding and appreciation of the Town's commitment to protect the environment while engaging in responsible recreation on a town-owned resource.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR DEVELOPMENT

Name

BWC believes the following name change is in order to better reflect and appreciate the natural terrain and features of the property, including the existing brook: ***Leaping Well Nature Trail***. The name "Leaping Well" itself implies a play on words for a healthy activity outdoors on a nature trail!

Access

- Main public access: via Newton Manor Street
- Parking lot built at the end of Newton Manor Street (on Toth property) in the manner of the River-To-Range Trail for parking spots, including ADA parking
- Bike racks
- Trail routes could also begin/end on the Mosier Elementary School property (enabling school group access for field study programs)

Features & Amenities

- Passive Recreation use only: Trails throughout property to accommodate off-road biking and walking/hiking
- Designated lighted routes (passive solar source only) to encourage regular use during twilight hours (a popular time period for outdoor exercise especially for those who work during the day) and enhance safety
- Security Cameras at entry points (passive solar source)
- Level surface in designated areas for young bikers, seniors, low vision and low mobility groups
- Benches for resting/vista spots
- As appropriate/necessary, wooden boardwalks to stay off the ground, avoid ticks, easy for mobility challenged, low vision groups and small children, along with trail-appropriate surfaces in other areas (akin to Silvio Conte Refuge). Portions of the total trail system to be ADA accessible whenever possible.
- Set aside a small number of acres designated for science and art curriculum programs (keep open for public access). Examples: weather station, specimen collection/analysis, "art drawing" spots
- Wetlands education stations and a "Project Stream" opportunity, inc. benches for a small audience gathering spot
- Flora and fauna "scavenger hunt" stations
- Exercise stations, aka Circuit Training Stations

- Wayfinding, information boards and connection signage, inc. map boxes
- Compost toilet restrooms, located at the Newton Manor Street main access point
- Trash receptacles, located at the Newton Manor Street main access point

Anticipated Users for Walking and/or Biking

- Pre-elementary-school aged children
- Students: elementary through college
- Adults of all ages
- Young parents (with or without strollers)
- Sight-impaired, low vision and low mobility groups

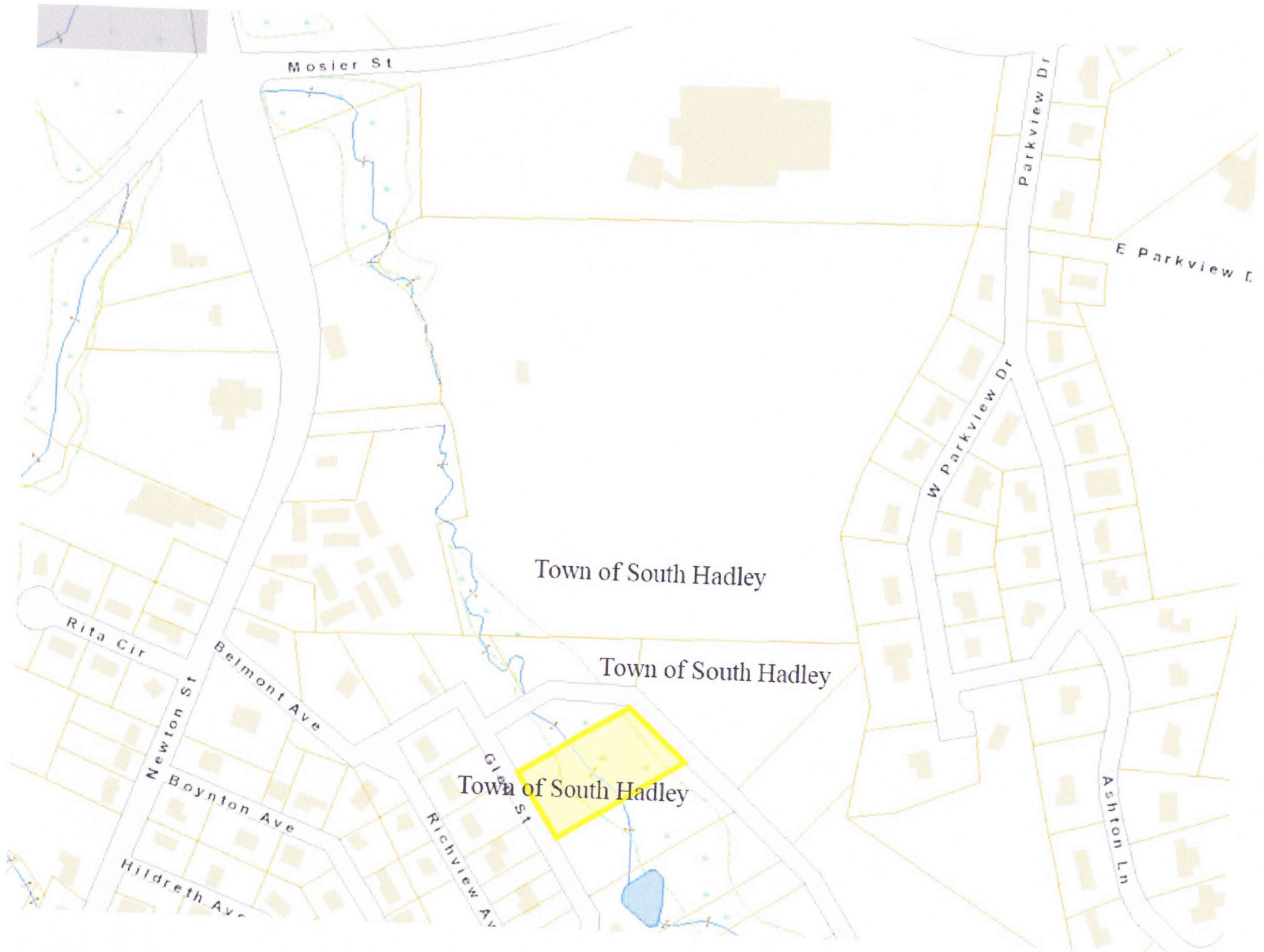

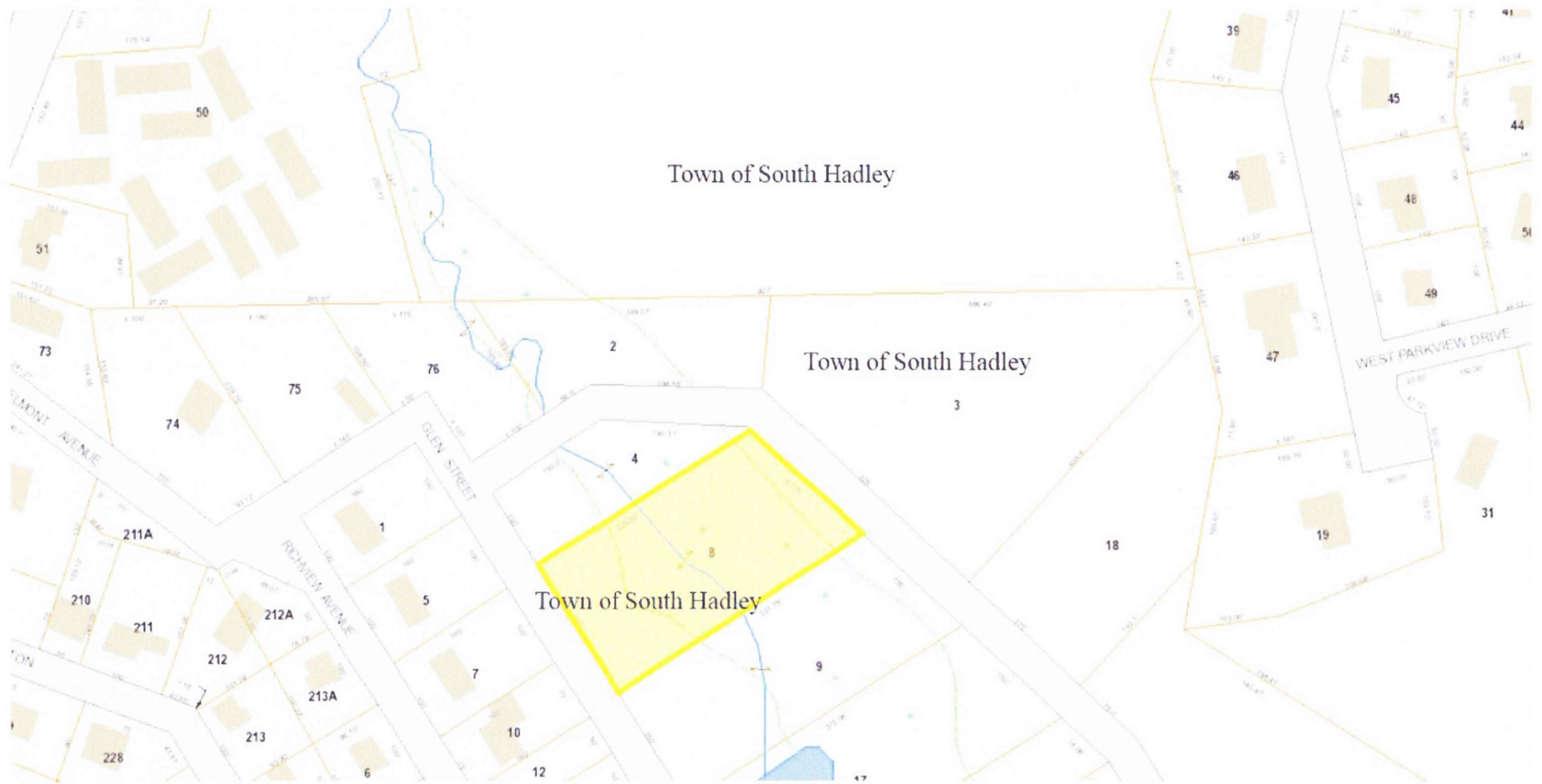

South Hadley's Hahn-Warner Arboretum—a place where a variety of trees are grown for the enjoyment of all, was the idea of the two people for whom it is named, George Hahn and Edwin T. Warner. It was formed in the spring of 1970, when Mr. Hahn, a middle-school science teacher, first teamed up with Mr. Warner, the town Tree Warden. Together they created and took care of the Arboretum and organized an annual Arbor Day planting with students at the middle school. This tradition continued with Mr. Hahn working with later Tree Wardens, and Linda Warner Young, Mr. Warner's daughter. Middle school science teacher Maria Drobiak is now the science teacher involved in the Arbor Day event, with her students reading Arbor Day essays and helping to plant the tree. Each year the tree is dedicated in honor of someone or some group in South Hadley.

In 2012 Town Meeting voted to approve the Conservation Commission taking over management of the Arboretum, at the request of the Friends of the Arboretum (George Hahn and Linda Warner). The Friends are still active in the Arbor Day festivities, and providing advice to the Commission.

The Arboretum is located mostly in back of Michael E. Smith Middle School, up the hill and beyond the soccer fields. Parking is in the school parking lot. A path runs along the edge of the grass, parallel to the Stony Brook wetland to the east. A few trees are also planted in front, near the sign along Mosier Street. All planted trees are tagged with a number, and the tree list is available online.

I am very excited for my second year at the Ledges GC and I know our staff is eager to get to work. Mother Nature clearly has other ideas for us and keeps pushing off any projected opening date we may have. Hopefully, we can open sometime in the next 10-14 days. We had originally planned to open on March 17; however, the snow storm has set us back weeks. With snow in the forecast tomorrow, I am not sure how far that will set us back. Golf is such a weather dependent activity and often makes it difficult to make projections.

Head Professional Jim Falco has been hard at work since March 6 when he returned for the 2017 season. He has called every Annual Passholder that has not renewed for 2017 inviting them back, has contacted each league representative to set their schedule and we have both been very active in securing outside outings. Additionally, we have set a schedule of club tournaments for the year including glow balls, two-balls, and some opening/closing scrambles. In addition to those, Jim is working on starting a PGA Junior League targeting young golfers (ages 13 and under), beginner clinics designed for women, summer golf program and looking to expand our TGYF couples league on Friday night. Assistant Professional James Hampton will start when the course officially opens for the season.

Food and Beverage Manager Lee Bourdon will return on Monday, April 3rd and will hit the ground running. We have 13 outside events on the calendar in May and June and she will certainly do well with those. We are looking to have limited menu in April and establishing our full service in May once the golf business picks up. She is looking on continuing with a pub style menu with some daily/weekly specials featuring some entrees. Our concentration will be on building the business and we are going to try a few different things to accomplish that.

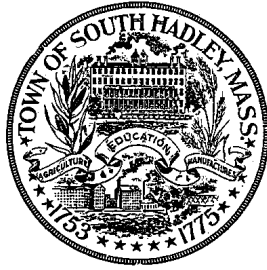
The rest of our staff will return once we open and have been working on the hiring with HR over the past few months. It looks like we have some applicants from the school program which should help us in the kitchen. Cook coverage will always be our biggest challenge.

Over the winter months, I concentrated on some major tasks. We relaunched our website (www.ledgesgc.com) and I am thrilled with the outcome there. New this season, we are starting with ItsOnMe which is an online gift certificate platform which specializes in the golf industry. We have a new POS system on the Valley View side which will sync with the golf software which was also upgraded. There were some improvements made to the building and lots of cleaning to try to make it as presentable as possible. I have been working on the marketing side with many of the golf groups that specialize in that as well as some radio/tv for this year. Jim, James and myself also attend the WMass Golf Show and networked with hundreds of golfers at that event.

I turned off almost every appliance in the building over the winter and we did realize a decent savings of about \$500 per month over the previous year. To be honest, I thought it would be a little more! We will continue to stress customer service this year; however, I also recognize we must schedule the staff in a more efficient way. I will need to request additional funds for a variety of reasons which I will cover in a different document at the upcoming special town meeting.

Re: Annual Appointment List

As you may remember, per the Annual Appointment Policy approved September 16, 2014, *“A list will be delivered to the Selectboard for all fiscal year appointments scheduled for July 1st by the first Selectboard meeting in April. The list will include the following: the length of term, and whether it is presently filled or open.”*

Attached please find a list of appointed boards/committees showing all positions with terms expiring June 30, 2017, together with existing vacancies. Please note that incumbents have not yet been consulted as to their interest in seeking reappointment and may indeed be willing to continue serving.
