The COA supports the well-being of the older adult community by providing services to support their nutritional, emotional, social and recreational needs. The COA provides information, referrals and support programs for older adults and is considered the go-to resource for residents of any age with concerns about aging relatives, neighbors and friends. Aging in Place: A Health and Wellness Fair on June 14th, 2022. Estimated 250+ individuals attended the fair. The center invited 40+ vendors to the Aging in Place fair. The COA had a table to highlight our resources and services. (Alzheimer's Caregiver Support Group and Memory Cafe, Caregiver Respite Grant.) The COA & Fire districts 182 have collaborated on a Falls Prevention Program since Nov. 2021 with a total of 54 seniors participating. The program offers seniors a survey to assess fall risks in the home and then a visit from their FD. All Coffee and Conversation programs, special events and lifelong learning lecture series are taped and played on Channel 15. Basic Fitness, Gentle Yoga, Seated and Standing Yoga and Tai Chi are aired live on Channel 15 and taped for later use.
